advise (v.) <i>Balto</i> p. 44	to tell; inform, notify	My parents advised me about what to take on my trip.
hazardous (adj.) <i>Balto</i> p. 50	full of danger; having great or many risks	Smoking is hazardous to one's health.
cherish (v.) Letter to Mrs. Roosevelt p. 57	to love dearly, to adore	The teacher cherished the children that came through his door and prayed for them every day.
shift (v.) <i>The Iron Dragon</i> p. 41	to move, change the direction of	Our family shifted from town to town.
excursion (n.) Letter to Mrs. Roosevelt p. 97	a recreational trip or outing	The kids took an excursion through the park to look for leaves.
captivate (v.) <i>Balto</i> p. 93	To charm or fascinate, as by beauty or wit	She was captivated by the gracefulness of the dancers.
