souvenir (n.) <i>Cam Jansen</i> Ch. 2	something that serves as a reminder	I bought a keychain at Disneyland as a souvenir.
flurry (n.) <i>Ramona</i> Ch. 3	a brief period of commotion or excitement	There was a flurry of activity at the county fair.
summon (v.) <i>Charlotte's Web</i> Ch. 9	to call upon for something specific	Herod summoned the Wise Men to tell him about the prophecy.
jolly (adj.) <i>Cam Jansen</i> Ch. 5	full of high spirits, joyous	The children were jolly after the pep assembly.
nuisance (n.) <i>Ramona</i> Ch. 6	something that is annoying, unpleasant, or obnoxious	The rock in my shoe was becoming a nuisance.
surpass (v.) <i>Charlotte's Web</i> Ch. 16	to go beyond, exceed, overstep	The movie was so good that it surpassed our expectations.
governor (n.) <i>Cam Jansen</i> Ch. 8	someone that has authority over a group, usually elected	The governor gave a speech after he won the election.
sullen (adj.) <i>Ramona</i> Ch. 9	gloomy, silent, grave	The home crowd was sullen after their team lost on the last shot.
thrash (v.) <i>Charlotte's Web</i> Ch. 21	to move or stir about violently	The bug thrashed trying to get out of the web.
